## ABSTRACT GUIDELINES

We invite Australia or New Zealand-based early career researchers to submit an abstract to present novel research in the field of hallucinations. We define early career researchers loosely as those completing postgraduate studies or having completed them within the past 10 years. We also invite submissions from honours and Masters students. We welcome abstracts for oral or poster presentations from a broad range of fields relevant to hallucinations, hearing voices, and unusual sensory experiences.

Abstracts for oral presentations and posters will be judged and scored by our scientific committee for innovation and scientific quality. Those scoring highest will be invited as brief oral or 'three-minute thesis' style presentations. The remainder will be featured on our website in the form of conference posters to showcase the research being conducted by early career hallucinations researchers in Australia and New Zealand. You will also have the option to select to submit only a conference poster, should this be preferred.

Notification of acceptance will be emailed to the corresponding author approximately four weeks prior to the event, along with more detailed information about the event and poster/oral presentation guidelines.

Before submitting an abstract, please note the following ECHR ANZ 2020 Conference abstract submission guidelines:

1. The presenting author is required to ensure that all co-authors are aware of and have agreed to the contents of the abstract prior to submission. The presenting author (or representative) must also register for the conference and commit to attend.

2. The presenting/corresponding author's details must be provided, including full name, institutional affiliation(s), email address and contact number. Co-authors' full names and institutional affiliation(s) must also be listed.

3. Abstracts must be presented in clear English with accurate grammar and spelling of a quality suitable for publication.

4. The abstract title is limited to 20 words, and the abstract body is limited to 200 words.

5. The abstract must be presented in a structured format, including sections for Background, Method, Results, and Conclusions.

6. The abstract deadline is 28 September 2020, and no further changes will be accepted once abstracts have been submitted.

7. Submission represents your acknowledgement for the abstract to be printed on the website, conference program and any other promotional material.
